What is Conflict?

- A problem that occurs between characters/forces in a story.
- Conflict is the driving force of plot.

Types of Conflicts

- External Struggle- A struggle between a person and an outside force.
 - Character vs. Character
 - Character vs. Nature
 - Character vs. Society
- Internal Struggle- A struggle occurring with a characters mind.
 - Character vs. Self


Character vs. Character

- Character v. Character- An external struggle when one character has a problem with another character(s)
- Examples: Harry Potter vs. Voldemort, Luke vs. Darth Vader, Cinderella vs. Evil Stepsisters



Character vs. Nature

- Character v. Nature- An external struggle. A character is faced with a problem that is an element of nature;
 - Sea Forests
 - Desert Storms
 - Jungle Earthquakes
 - Mountains Volcanos
- Survival is the most common theme in novels with this conflict.
- Characters demonstrate creativity, bravery, resourcefulness, problem-solving and adaptation in order to survive.



Character vs. Society

Character v. Society- An

external struggle between a character and a social force or condition produced by society.

 Such as poverty, political revolution, set of values or rules set forth by society.





Character vs. Self

 Character v. Self- this is an internal struggle within a character, where aspects of his or her personality may struggle for dominance.

 These aspects may be emotional, intellectual, or moral
