- ✓ Two pages typed; four pages handwritten
- ✓ This story should be about one incident.
- ✓ Have two to three characters.
- ✓ A clear beginning, middle, and end that develops the experience of the main character (you).
- ✓ Includes vivid description of setting and characterization; including dialogue and concrete sentences

✓ Must have a clear theme. Remember a theme is not a topic but a lesson.

You will need to turn in your rough draft, peer edits, writer's notebook, and final draft.

Structure	 Introduction- Begin with an attention-grabbing hook. Set the scene. Tell how your experience began. Body Paragraphs- Describe the order of events. Build to the point where you realize the change. Use transitions. Conclusion- Reflect on what you learned or how you changed as a result of the experience or event. 	10
