- You will create the following:
  - Cover: Must have a catchy title, an image/illustration, name, and hour 0
  - $\cap$ Page 1
    - **Table of Contents** 
      - Include the page number(s), title of your poem(s), and what type of poem it is. Example: Page 2 Give Thanks Free Verse Poem
  - Pages 2-3 0

Page 8 Bring all your friends. 0 Just don't forget to bring your odds and ends **One Diamante Poem** The text of this poem is written in the shape of a diamond. **Example Diamante Poem** • Line 1: Use a noun or subject Ocean • Line 2: Two adjectives that describe your noun or subject Deep, Blue • Line 3: Use three 'ing words that describe your noun or subject Crashing, Blowing, Turning • Line 4: A sentence about the subject

- Line 5: Use three 'ing words to describe your noun or subject
- Line 6: Use two adjectives that describe your noun or subject
- Line 7: Use a synonym (a word that means exactly the same) for your subject or noun
- *Extra Credit:* For ten points extra credit: Write two free verse poems at least ten lines. Or write four quatrain poems—rhyme scheme AABB, ABAB, ABBA, ABCB
