Vocabulary Word	Definition	Sentence
1. <i>Belittle</i>	v. Make someone or something seem unimportant.	My brother belittles me when he's around his friends.
2. <i>Facilitate</i>	v. Make an action or process easy or easier.	The instructor facilitated by demonstrating how to properly put on scuba gear.
3. <i>Inadvertent</i>	Adj. Not resulting from or achieved through deliberate planning.	I inadvertently won money by guessing on a question.
4. <i>Tangible</i>	Adj. Capable of being touched; real	The food on TV looked so good it was almost tangible .
5. <i>Advocate</i>	V. A person who speaks or writes in support or defense of a person, cause, etc.	Those who advocate for civil rights believe in equality.
6. <i>Comply</i>	V. A person or group who acts in accordance with a wish or command.	I had to comply when the officer asked for my license.
7. <i>Divert</i>	V. Cause (someone or something) to change course or turn from one direction to another.	I diverted from the road when the deer ran out in front of me.
8. <i>Zealous</i>	Adj. Marked by active interest and enthusiasm.	I was zealous for the Drake concert.
9. <i>Ambiguous</i>	Adj. Having several possible meanings or interpretations	Some art is very ambiguous .
10. <i>Animated</i>	Adj. Full of life, action, or spirit.	My teacher was always so animated when talking about books she liked.
11. <i>Enigma</i>	N. A puzzling or inexplicable occurrence or situation.	Clowns in Detroit were a bit of an enigma .
12. <i>Indifferent</i>	Adj. Lack of interest or concern; not caring; apathetic.	I was indifferent on whether I wanted to go out this weekend.
13. <i>Repress</i>	V. To stop or restrain	I had to repress my feelings for the boy because he had a girlfriend.
14. <i>Authentic</i>	Adj. Not false or copied; genuine; real	It's important to choose authentic friends.
15. <i>Negligent</i>	Adj. Guilty of or characterized by neglect, as of duty.	The drunk driver was negligent and careless when he got on the road.
16. <i>Resignation</i>	N. The act of resigning.	I turned in my resignation on Friday and my boss was upset.
17. <i>Appease</i>	V. To bring to a state of peace, quiet, ease, calm.	I tried to appease my brother from crying at the carnival.
18. <i>Condone</i>	V. Excuse, overlook, or make allowances for	I don't condone smoking. Yuck.
19. <i>Explicit</i>	Adj. Fully and clearly expressed or demonstrated; leaving nothing implied.	I explicitly told you not to put a fork in the outlet.
20. <i>Accentuate</i>	V. To stress, single out as important	My mascara accentuated my eyes making them pop.
