4. Conjure	V. Summon; bring into existence.	It had been years since I saw his face, but I was often able to conjure an image of him in my head.
5. Abomination	N. Something or someone that causes disgust or hatred.	Double dipping into my food would be an abomination .
6. Exude	V. Make apparent by one's behavior or mood.	Mr. Warner exuded confidence and experience as he taught.
7. Abide	V. Go along with something or someone; obey.	When my mom told me I had to be in by midnight, I had to abide to her wishes.
8. Afflict	V. Cause pain or suffering.	Divorce tends to cause the most affliction to the children.
9. Calculated	Adj. Carefully planned out or planned in advance.	I had calculated for when we would need to stop for gas on the trip, I did not foresee blowing a tire.
