7. Presumptuous	Making a judgment before knowing of all the facts; extremely bold and forward in doing something.	The students were <i>presumptuous</i> to think their teacher would not give them homework over the weekend.
8. Scrupulous	Very careful about doing something.	If you want to keep your dog, you need to be <i>scrupulous</i> about completing your work in the proper fashion.
9. Unequivocal	Leaving no doubt; unambiguous	Since we raised a million dollars for our charity, we considered fundraiser to be an <i>unequivocal</i> success.
10. Animosity	A strong feeling of disliking something or someone.	During the match, the <i>animosity</i> between the two wrestlers was obvious.
