Vocabulary Word	Definition	Sentence
1. <i>Undermine</i>	Damage or weaken (someone or something); sabotage	Tim's colleagues tried to <i>undermine</i> him by saying that his work was forged.
2. <i>Magnanimous</i>	Very generous or forgiving; unselfish	Because she was kind and generous, the <i>magnanimous</i> queen was loved by all.
3. <i>Anarchy</i>	Chaos; a state of disorder due to the absence of authority or lack of government.	As soon as the teacher stepped in the hall, the classroom descended into <i>anarchy</i> .
4. <i>Inclination</i>	A person's natural tendency or urge to act or feel in a particular way.	A coward's natural <i>inclination</i> is to walk away from a fight.
5. <i>Scapegoat</i>	A person or group made to bear the blame for others or to suffer in their place.	The young boy used the puppy as a <i>scapegoat</i> when his father came across the broken picture frame on the floor.
6. <i>Extraneous</i>	Irrelevant or unrelated to the subject being dealt with.	If you want to get a good night's sleep, it's important to remove any <i>extraneous</i> light and sound from the area.
7. <i>Presumptuous</i>	Making a judgment before knowing of all the facts; extremely bold and forward in doing something.	The students were <i>presumptuous</i> to think their teacher would not give them homework over the weekend.
8. <i>Scrupulous</i>	Very careful about doing something.	If you want to keep your dog, you need to be <i>scrupulous</i> about completing your work in the proper fashion.
9. <i>Unequivocal</i>	Leaving no doubt; unambiguous	Since we raised a million dollars for our charity, we considered fundraiser to be an <i>unequivocal</i> success.
10. <i>Animosity</i>	A strong feeling of disliking something or someone.	During the match, the <i>animosity</i> between the two wrestlers was obvious.
